

New Researcher Checklist

Before starting work in a laboratory a newly arrived researcher must be made aware of the following:

Emergency phone numbers* :

On internal phones: 811 (main campus) or 511 (health campus)

On external phones: 819 821-7699 (main campus)(e.g. cellular)819 346-1110, ext. 14121 (health campus)Mobile application:https://www.usherbrooke.ca/smsp/securite/application-securiteudes

* The emergency number must be called **immediately** in the event of a fire, spill or injury in the laboratory. An intervention team is available 24/7 for any problem related to hazardous materials.

- Two tier alarm system: the pre-alarm and evacuation alarm
