- The successful candidate must be able to teach in French or be able to do so in the short term.
- Expected to develop strong leadership within the field cardiovascular research.
- To be able to abide to the requirements in line with the responsible behavior of research.
- Experience in interdisciplinary, multidisciplinary, or transdisciplinary research as well as in knowledge transfer will be considered an asset.
