# INSTRUCTION GUIDE FOR COMPLETING THE APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION FORM (DA-3)

<u>Please note that l'Université de Sherbrooke is a French-speaking institution. Most of the information on the Web site and official communication are in French.</u>

### **Important**

- An official notice of admission or refusal will be issued for each of the programs selected (in French).
- If an interview or test is required for admission, the information will be sent to you by the faculty involved.
- AN APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION IS NOT THE SAME AS REGISTRATION. If your application is accepted, you will have to follow the procedures required within the prescribed time period, which you will be informed of in due course.

# Submit your application for admission and follow your file online (in French)

The form enables an applicant to apply for admission into two programs for the same semester. Make sure you provide a valid e-mail address to be able to receive an acknowledgement of receipt (in French), which will include your student ID number.

You can follow your file online (in French), via our Web site, as it progresses through the steps in the process. At <a href="https://www.USherbrooke.ca/admission">www.USherbrooke.ca/admission</a>, you can:

- Check the status of the processing of your application (all documents required must be provided before the deadline).
- · Respond to an offer of admission.
- Confirm your decision and make the first payment (by credit card).

## **PLEASE READ BEFORE YOU START**

#### **DEADLINES**

*Undergraduate programs*: Bachelor's degree programs, doctorate in medicine, certificates, and microprograms.

 Fall semester: January 15 Classes begin: End of August

 Winter semester: September 1 Classes begin: Beginning of January

Graduate programs: Master's degree programs, PhD programs, microprograms, and diploma programs.

Applications for admission may be submitted at any time. However, we strongly recommend submitting your complete file (the required documents and payment) six to eight months prior to the start of your program. This time period will enable the university to have sufficient time to analyze your file. This will also give you the time needed to obtain your study permit.

This time period may vary from one faculty to another. It is recommended that you contact the faculty in charge of the program.

Please note that the university will consider your application for admission solely for the semester indicated on your form.

#### **DOCUMENTS REQUIRED**

Every application for admission must be accompanied by documents attesting to the person's identity and ability to undertake university studies. These documents will remain the property of the Université de Sherbrooke and will not be returned to the student.

The Registrar's Office reserves the right to ask you for any other document that could help complete your file. It is the student's responsibility to provide the missing documents within the time frame determined by the Université (see the deadlines above).

An official French translation must be included if the documents are written in a language other than English or French.

#### Legal documents

Should you fail to provide the documents listed below, you will not be able to register at the Université de Sherbrooke. When photocopied documents are attached, there must be only one supporting document per photocopied sheet, and this document must be positioned in the upper right-hand corner of the page.

You must provide a birth certificate (photocopy accepted). You are not required to provide your birth certificate if you have studied in an educational institution in Quebec.

In addition to your birth certificate:

- If you are a Canadian, but born abroad, you must provide a copy of both sides of your Canadian Citizenships card (including an identification number).
- If you indicate you are a permanent resident, you must send us:
  - a copy of your IMM-5292 form and a copy of both sides of your Permanent Resident card or a copy of your IMM-1000 form from the Department of Citizenship and Immigration Canada.

#### Fees for opening a file

A fee of \$70 CAD must be paid for the evaluation of your file. Your file will not be evaluated if this fee has not been paid. Fees for opening a file are not refundable.

#### Specific cases

- If you submitted an application for admission to the Université de Sherbrooke on a previous occasion, but did not register afterwards, you must submit the required documents again and pay the fee of \$70 CAD.
- If you are currently registered at the Université de Sherbrooke and wish to change programs: there are no fees for opening a file.

#### Pay the fees for opening a file

#### **IMPORTANT**

To ensure that the payment is linked to the right file, include the student's last and first names and student ID number.

#### Transcripts of academic records and diplomas

If you fail to provide all of the documents required, your file will not be analyzed and your application may even be refused. It is the student's responsibility to provide all of the documents attesting to his/her academic and career path required for the analysis of his/her file, before the deadline.

· If you have studied outside of Quebec

You must ask each educational institution located outside of Quebec that you attended after high school to send a transcript of your marks directly to the Université de Sherbrooke Registrar's Office (for the address, see page 1 of this document).

If it is a university-level institution, the transcript must bear the seal of the institution issuing it, as well as the marking system (in some cases, this appears on the back of the transcript). All transcripts of marks from an educational institution outside of Quebec must be accompanied by a document explaining the marking system.

You must also send us a copy of each diploma you have obtained, beginning with the final year of high school.

· If you have attended CEGEP in Quebec

If you have provided a valid permanent code from the Ministère de l'Éducation, du Loisir et du Sport (MELS), you do not need to send this transcript.

If you have attended university in Quebec

You must ask each educational institution that you have attended to send a transcript of your marks directly to the Université de Sherbrooke Registrar's Office.

Documents attesting to skills and knowledge acquired

If applicable, you may send us any supporting information (letters of recommendation, letter of intent, and curriculum vitæ) that you deem useful or necessary to the review of your application for admission, especially if you are applying for admission based on acquired knowledge and skills. It is important to note that not all programs consider acquired skills as a basis for admission.

It is the student's responsibility to provide all of the documents required for his/her file within the established time frames.

Note on the cooperative education program (alternating work experience / study terms)

The Université de Sherbrooke's cooperative education program, which consists of alternating sessions of study and paid work in businesses or government bodies, is currently not open to international students.

#### Contention and the right to appeal

In a case of contention, the reference document to consult is the Université de Sherbrooke's academic regulations. The Université reserves the right to change its regulations, programs, and procedures without prior notice. If you have submitted your candidature and you feel you have been wronged by a decision, you may submit a request for an appeal within 15 days of the transmission of the Registrar's decision. To do so, you must communicate to the Registrar, in writing, and from the perspective of the admission criteria, the grounds upon which you are basing your appeal. #### Important note from the Registrar's Office

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE DA-3 FORM

You must fill out an application for admission when you wish to register for a study program. You must also complete this form if:

- you have already applied for admission without registering;
- you are studying at the Université de Sherbrooke and you wish to change programs;
- you temporarily interrupted your studies at the Université de Sherbrooke for more than 16 consecutive months and wish to reapply in the same program;
- you are applying for independent studies (In this case, you must complete a new application for admission by hand each semester.)

Box 1a – In block letters, print your family name and first name(s) as they appear on your birth certificate. Note: this name will follow you throughout your studies at the Université de Sherbrooke and will appear on your graduation diploma.

Box 1b - Print the family names and first names of your mother and father as they appear on your birth certificate.

Box 8 – If you have a Canadian social insurance number, write it in this box.

Boxes 12, 13, 14 – List each of the institutions you have attended since completing high school, starting with the most recent. If you have attended training sessions, courses, or workshops in the context of your job or a leisure activity and this training relates to your application, please provide all of the information pertaining to this activity. For the most recent program taken, you must indicate the field of study code for the program, based on the following table:

Box 15 — Candidates who indicated a language other than French in this box for one or the other of the two most recent educational institutions attended may be asked to take a Université de Sherbrooke French second-language proficiency test as stipulated in the academic regulations.

Box 16 - Your application for admission must not contain more than two choices of programs for the same semester for which you are applying.

Box 17 – This box is reserved for individuals wishing to be admitted to independent studies. Indicate the name of the faculty to which you are applying for admission and the code of each of the teaching activities in which you wish to register. These codes can be found at www.USherbrooke.ca/programmes/fac/.

Box 18 – You may be admitted to certain programs on the basis of skills acquired within the context of your work, or on the basis of relevant experience. In either of these cases, please check the box and attach your curriculum vitæ to your application, along with a letter of interest in which you explain in what way the skills you have acquired and/or your relevant experience will enable you to pursue university studies in your chosen discipline.

Box 19 - Indicate only the full-time jobs you have held, or describe any experience relevant to your chosen discipline.

Box 20 – If you are applying for admission to Master's or PhD level studies, you must provide us with the names of the people who have been asked to send us a letter of recommendation. Instruct the individuals from whom you have asked a letter of recommendation to send the letters directly to the faculty department concerned. One of these letters must come from a professor who has played a vital role in your education. Certain programs require a curriculum vitæ and/or letters of recommendation. Please consult the faculty involved. For more details pertaining to letters of recommendation, please consult the Admission Guide for International Students.

#### **THE 8 STEPS IN YOUR APPLICATION PROCESS**

STEP 1: Fill Out Admission Form DA-3

You must first complete the Application for Admission Form DA-3. If you complete the form by hand, you must send it by mail, along with the required documents, to the Registrar's Office. If you do not provide all of the required documents, including the fees to open your file, your file will not be analyzed and may even be refused. Once your file is received, your application will be processed through the following steps.

#### STEP 2: Acknowledgement of Receipt

If you provide a valid e-mail address (box 3 of the form), you will receive an electronic acknowledgement of receipt (in French) when the Registrar's Office receives your application. In addition to confirming reception of your application for admission, this document will give you the information required to follow the evolution of your file via the Université's Web site. If you prefer to receive an acknowledgement of receipt by mail (in French), you must include a pre-stamped return envelope pre-addressed in your name with your application.

#### STEP 3: Your File Is Reviewed

Once all of the required documents, including payment of the fees for opening your file, have been received, the Registrar's Office can begin to study your file. The timeline for processing your application for admission may vary due to several factors, including the particularities of each program, and the student category within which you fall. If you have made two program choices on the same application for admission, these will be studied separately. Selection procdures differ from one program to another. #### STEP 4: The Université Responds to Your Application (in French)

After an analysis of your file, you will receive one of the following responses for each of the programs selected:

- · an unconditional offer of admission;
- · an offer of admission;
- · a delayed decision, for reasons that will be communicated to you;
- · a refusal.

If you have provided a valid e-mail address, you will receive a copy of your response electonically. Official written notification will follow by mail in the subsequent days. An official letter issued by the Registrar constitutes the Université's sole binding confirmation of your position as a student.

STEP 5: The Université Sends You Legal Documents to Complete for Your Entry into Canada (in French)

This step concerns international students who will enter the country with student visa status.

With your response, you will receive (in French):

- three original admission response letters (on the back of these letters you'll find information enabling you to obtain your Québec Acceptance Certificate (or CAQ) and your study permit);
- an Application for a Québec Acceptance Certificate (CAQ) for studies form, and instructions for payment by credit card;
- · a document on costs for international students:
- a mandatory health insurance document for international students.

It is your responsibility to undertake the necessary steps to obtain the legal documents required for your entry into Canada. #### STEP 6: Your Response to the Offer of Admission (in French)

If you have received an offer of admission, you must confirm you are maintaining your candidature before the deadline indicated; otherwise the university may assume you are withdrawing. If you respond online, you will immediately obtain confirmation of your decision. If you prefer to confirm your decision by mail, you must complete the response sheet provided for this purpose. It is imperative that you choose only one of these two methods of confirmation (online or by mail) to avoid any duplication or ambiguity. Please note that the Université will consider your application for admission only for the semester you have indicated on your form.

#### STEP 7: Reserving Your Space

To reserve your space, you must pay a deposit on your tuition fees before the deadline indicated; otherwise the Université may assume you are withdrawing. You can pay the fees online with a credit card, or by mail using the payment methods indicated. If you pay online, you will immediately obtain confirmation of your payment.

#### STEP 8: Registering

Admission to the Université de Sherbrooke is only valid if it is followed by registration. Only registration gives you student statis at the Université. You will be required to register for each subsequent semester. A few weeks before classes begin, your faculty will send you all of the information that will enable you to register.
